



## Rob Herb

Rob Herb, a product of Dulaney High School (MD), was one of the most dominant mid-fielders on the Mount's early lacrosse teams in the seventies. While playing for Coach Randy Kilgore, he played an important role in the team's success on the field. Along with fellow hall of Famers Spence Jeffries, Brian Barry, Dave Burns and Bob Barnett, Herb helped to forge and build the Mount's strong reputation in the NCAA lacrosse community.

Herb finished his career among the leaders in groundballs in his era and won more than 55% of his face-offs over the course of his career. While Herb had many impressive efforts during his days on Echo Field, he will be long remembered by Mount Lacrosse fans for the 30 points he scored as a defensive midfielder; an absolutely stunning feat.

Herb was a starter at midfield for every game of his career. In 1978, his senior season, he was named the Mount's Most Valuable Player and Player of the Year, a year he also served as team captain. In 1978, Rob received the Kolon Award, given to a student-athlete who best represents the ideals of a Mount St. Mary's University student-athlete; the first year this prestigious award was presented.

In addition to his impressive lacrosse career, Herb has been a long-time friend and ambassador for Mount athletics. After graduation, Herb served as full-time assistant lacrosse coach for two years. He served as the President of the Mount's Athletic Association for two years and is one of the founders and original directors of the "Mount Club" where he continues to be active today. Herb truly epitomizes Mount Spirit through his selfless service and unwavering commitment to the Mount.
