



Will Vanjonack

Will Vanjonack only donned a Mount baseball uniform for three seasons after transferring from Albright College, but in those three seasons the Newark, Delaware, native became one of the best power hitters in program history .

Vanjonack gave a glimpse of things to come in his first game as a Mountaineer, going 2-for-3 with an RBI double in the fifth inning against the College of Charleston. He would finish the year with a .336 batting average, nine home runs, 10 doubles and 32 RBIs to earn a spot on the All-Northeast Conference first team as an outfielder.

He continued to excel in his second season in Emmitsburg and became the first of many power hitters to come for first-year head coach Scott Thomson. He posted a .357 batting average with 11 home runs, seven doubles and 35 RBIs. Vanjonack drilled two home runs and went 3-for-5 with three RBIs in a 10-7 win against the University of Maryland-Baltimore County. In his next game, Vanjonack was 4-for-6 with a homer, two runs scored and six RBIs in a 19-6 victory against Coppin State. He smacked two homers and recorded five RBIs in an 8-5 win against Wagner nine days later.

Vanjonack saved his best season in a Mount uniform for his senior year, boasting a single-season program-record batting average of .388 along with 17 doubles, eight home runs and 35 RBIs to earn his second All-NEC first-team selection. His doubles total paced the Northeast Conference while he also notched a team record for on-base percentage (.489) and second-most runs scored (45) on the year. He went 3-for-4 with three doubles and two RBIs against Monmouth and then went 3-for-4 with three runs scored and an RBI against the Hawks on the next day.

Vanjonack holds the school record for slugging percentage (.668) and on-base percentage (.447) while ranking second in batting average (.363), second in home runs (28) and fourth in RBIs (102). He also ranks in the Top-10 for his career in runs scored (97), hits (145), total bases (267), at-bats (400) and stolen bases (16). He also holds three of the Top-7 marks for slugging percentage and three of the Top-8 records for home runs in a single season.
