The time of the examination will be determined by the time of the first lecture period for the weekly schedule, e.g., a class scheduled for T H 9:30 and Wednesday 1:00 will have the examination at the time of the T H 9:30 class period. All examinations will be held in the classroom regularly used for the scheduled classes.
2. Make-up examinations will be given at a date and time convenient to the University.
3. Examinations in evening classes will be given at the regularly scheduled class time during the week of examinations.
4. Students should NOT attempt to take three exams in a single day. Students who find themselves in the position of being assigned to three exams in a day should speak with instructors and with the associate provost to generate ideas about alternate times to take one of the three exams.
5. Students and faculty are strongly encouraged to maintain exams at the scheduled times except for the reason outlined in #4. Students should *not* make travel plans assuming they will be able to move their exams as convenient. If exceptional circumstances arise, you must speak to the professor or Dean for Academic Affairs at least one month before exam time.
