

SPEAKERS



DR. SCOTT HAHN is an exceptionally popular speaker and teacher and has delivered numerous talks nationally and internationally on a wide variety of topics related to Scripture and the Catholic faith. He is the author of many books and articles,

both popular and scholarly, including *Reasons to Believe: How to Understand, Explain, and Defend the Catholic Faith* and *The Lamb's Supper: The Mass as Heaven on Earth*. His talks have been effective in helping thousands of Protestants and fallen away Catholics re-embrace the Catholic faith. He is currently a Professor of Theology and Scripture at Franciscan University of Steubenville where he has taught since 1990. He is also the founder and director of the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology; a non-profit research and educational institute that promotes life-transforming Scripture study in the Catholic tradition. Hahn and his wife, Kimberly, have been married since 1979 and have six children.



DR. BRANT PITRE is the Donum Dei Professor of Word and Sacrament at Our Lady of Holy Cross College in New Orleans, Louisiana. He received his Ph.D. in Theology from the University of Notre Dame, where he specialized the study of the New

Testament and ancient Judaism and graduated with highest honors. He is the author of several articles and a new book, *Jesus, the Tribulation, and the End of the Exile*, which focuses on the eschatology of Jesus as the key to the origin of the doctrine of the atonement (Baker Academic, 2005). Dr. Pitre is an extremely enthusiastic and engaging speaker and has produced several Bible studies on CD, in which he explores the Jewish roots and biblical background of Catholic faith and theology.

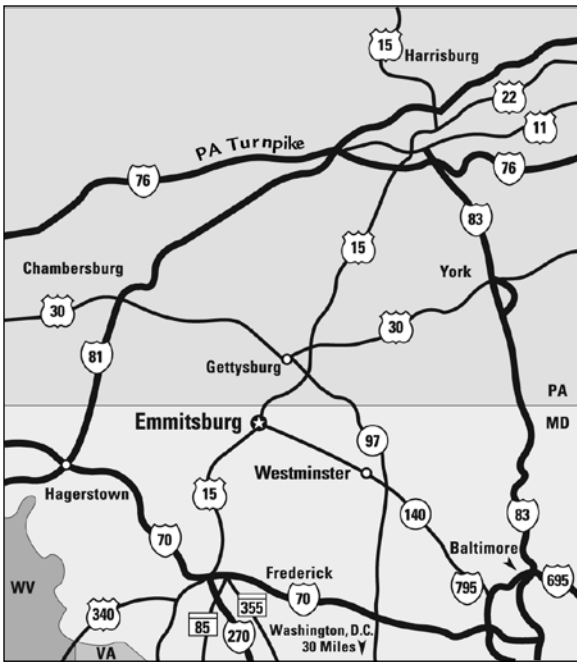

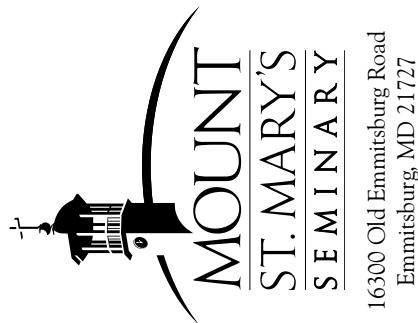
