Considering Grad School?

Back in the old days, a person could get by with just a high school diploma; having a college degree was something exceptional. Fast-forward to today, however, and you'll see quite a different scenario: a Bachelor's degree is essentially a requirement now. If you're considering grad school as part of your post-college life, here are a few questions to consider.

Why do you want to go?

If you're still unsure about what you want to do with your life, graduate school won't be very helpful in the long-run. You'll still be stuck not knowing what to do, and going into grad school without a clear goal could result in both time and money

Sometimes, though, you may not have a choice. If your profession requires at least a Master's degree, you'll definitely need to go to graduate school. Keep in mind that the opposite is true, too: some career fields do not need a degree higher than a Bachelor's, and your work experience may actually prove more useful.

Are you sure you're ready?

Graduate school is more academically challenging than undergraduate education; you will study one subject in great depth, and your work is more like that of an independent-study class. Also, consider whether or not you're emotionally ready for at least two more years of schooling

How will you pay for it?

Just like your undergraduate education, you can receive scholarships, grants, and loans to pay for grad school. Some grad schools also offer the option of becoming a Graduate Assistant or a Teaching Assistant to help finance your tuition. Finally, a number of employers have tuition-reimbursement programs for their employees who attend grad school part-time and still work for the company.
