



Provided in each residence hall room:

- Twin Extra Long Bed
- Dresser
- Desk
- Desk chair
- Closet
- Window shade
- Microfridge (mini refrigerator with freezer and microwave)

What to Bring...

- **Twin Extra Long Sheets** (80 inches in length requiring extra long sheets)
- **Linens:** towels, wash cloths, blankets, bedspread, and pillow.
- **Foam mattress top** for mattress (most students bring this)
- **Toiletries:** shower bucket, soap and soap dish, aspirin, first aid supplies, shampoo, conditioner, toothpaste, toothbrush, razors, hairdryer, etc.
- **Toilet Paper/Cleaning Supplies:** If you're lucky enough to be assigned to a suite with your own bathroom, you'll want to bring toilet paper and cleaning supplies to keep your suite bathroom stocked and cleaned throughout the year.
- **Household items:** laundry bag, laundry detergent, drying rack, paper towels, sewing kit, hangers, alarm clock, personal fan, desk lamp, *non-halogen* room lamp, cable wire, Ethernet cord, area carpet or rug (room sizes vary so measurements will have to be taken when you arrive), waste basket, and a hand vacuum.
- **Desk Supplies:** calculator, dictionary, thesaurus, paper punch, pencil sharpener, ruler, tape, scissors, personal computer (computer center is available to students), surge protector, bulletin board, memo board, stamps, book bag/back pack.
- **Curtains:** If you wish to provide curtains, Sheridan Hall window measurements: 66"x40". Pangborn Hall window measurements: (1st, 2nd, and 3rd floors) 62"x42" and (4th Floor) 36"x54". Terrace windows vary in size and you will have to wait until your arrival for those measurements.

What Not to Bring...

Non-permitted items will be confiscated and not returned to you so leave them at home!

Fire safety regulations prohibit the following appliances/devices:

- Space heaters, oil corn poppers, toaster ovens, toasters, hot plates, George Foreman Grills, additional microwaves
- Candles, incense, fireworks, firearms
- Electrical amplifiers, Bed Risers, air conditioners
- Halogen lamps and beanbag chairs
- Due to health code restrictions, cooking is not allowed in residence hall rooms.
- Road signs or other signs that were not legitimately purchased are not allowed.
- Please leave all pets at home (except small fish).



Decorating Don'ts...

The Office of Residence Life hopes all students feel as though their room on campus is their second home. Students must adhere to the following guidelines when decorating their rooms.

- **Do not use adhesives.** Mirror tiles, self adhesive cork boards, contact paper, "stickups" and double sided tape cause significant damage to the walls and you may be charged for that damage.
- **Do not place anything on the exterior room doors.**
- **Do not bring halogen lamps.** They are a significant fire safety hazard.
- **Do not Bring Candles or Incense or Incense Burners!**

Parking

New students are permitted to bring cars to campus. Registration Forms for your cars are in your Orientation folders and you may turn those in the day you arrive on campus to Public Safety. Freshmen and sophomore student parking is on East Campus by the ARCC in Lot 12. Junior and senior student parking is in Lot 7 and Lot 10.

Laundry Facilities

Cable Television

Each room is equipped with a cable television outlet that is connected to a 80-channel cable system. There is no charge to students but it is necessary to supply your own cable wire.

High Speed Internet is available for each student in every room. Wireless internet is available in all academic areas as well as the student dining facilities. Most residence halls are equipped with wireless internet, and all residence hall rooms are equipped with an Ethernet outlet.
